Rule 1

4. During a routine equipment inspection at the end of the first quarter, it is discovered that player A1 has gloves which have had the palm cut out. Referee assesses a one minute non-releasable penalty.

Rule 1

5. Player B is attacking the goal when the official notices that the goalie's throat protector is broken. The official allows play to continue until the next stoppage to correct the situation.

A: good call

B: bad call

Rule 1

6. A1, while driving to the goal, has his mouthpiece hanging from his facemask. Referee sounds whistle and assesses a 1 minute, non-releasable penalty.

Correct procedure?

Rule 4

33. B1 goes offside while chasing A1. Flag down. B2 also goes offside. Flag down. A2 then commits a personal foul. Correct procedure

A: A2's foul ends the slow whistle. B1 and B2 serve 30 seconds each. No time for A2. Award ball to Team A.

B: B1 and B2 serve 30 seconds each. A2 serves one minute. First 30 seconds are non-releasable for everyone. Award ball to Team A.

Rule 4

34. The ball is being cleared toward Team A's defensive end and A1, A2, and A3 are the only Team A players on Team A's offensive side. Which of the following results in a penalty for offside?

A: A1 steps on, but not over, the midfield line.

B: A1 realizes he is about to step over midfield but instead runs out of bounds and then quickly returns to his offensive end of the field without stepping in the defensive end.

Rule 4

35. The ball is rolling toward the midfield line. A1 and B1 are next to each other "fishing" for the ball as it rolls toward them. B1 steps on the midfield line and then gains control of the ball. Correct procedure

A: 30 second technical foul served by B1.

B: Award the ball to Team A at the center X, no time served.

Rule 4

36. Team A is in possession of the ball in the attack area when Team B is discovered to be offside. Flag down. Ball is shot, misses the goal and goes out of bounds on the endline. Correct procedure

A: 30 second penalty on player from Team B. Award the ball to Team A at the spot where the ball went out of bounds.

B: 30 second penalty on player from Team B. Award ball to Team A 20 yards laterally from the goal.

Rule 4

37. Team A is in possession of the ball deep in the attack zone when the official calls Team A for being offside.

Correct procedure

A: Award the ball to Team B outside the attack area.

B: Free clear, award the ball to Team B at the faceoff X.

Rule 4

38. Player A2 shoots and scores. As he shoots, the head of his crosse flies off. Correct procedure

A: goal counts, remove equipment from game until repaired

B: goal disallowed. Team B awarded the ball outside the box.

Rule 4

39. Goalkeeper is in possession of the ball in his crease. He brings his crosse and the ball back through the plane of the goal to throw a pass. Official at the pipe blows the whistle and signals that a goal has been scored.

A: Correct procedure. The ball has crossed the goal line.

B: Incorrect procedure. A goal is a loose ball that has completely crossed the goal line.

Rule 4

40. Can the goalkeeper be called for a personal foul if his crosse slashes an opposing player during a follow thru on an outlet pass?

A: No. It's the opponent's responsibility to get out of the way.

B: Yes. The privileges and protections of the goalkeeper do not permit him to gain an advantage.

Rule 4

41. The goalkeeper is in his crease, making a pass to begin his clear. Goalkeeper's crosse collides with crosse of A1, who is standing on the edge of the crease with his crosse in a covering position. Is this interference on A1?

A: yes

Rule 4

42. Loose ball **outside the goal crease**. Goalie A1 clamps his crosse over the ball in an attempt to rake the ball into the crease. Player B1 scoops through the stick of the goalie while the ball is outside the crease. The correct call is

A: interference by Team B. Award ball to Team A if goalie doesn't gain possession.

Rule 4

43. Ball is loose in the crease. Goalkeeper B1 picks up the ball with his hand and places the ball in his crosse. Correct procedure

A: legal play

B: technical foul. Award ball to Team A 20 yards from the goal.

Rule 4

44. B1, the goalkeeper, makes a save. He leaves the crease with the ball and is legally checked back into the crease by A1. Correct procedure

A: no foul, allow play to continue, new 4 second count.

B: crease violation on B1. Award the ball to Team A 20 yards laterally from the goal.

Rule 4

45. B1, the goalkeeper, makes a save but the ball bounces out of his crosse and is in the air in front of the goal and outside the crease. Attackman A1 bats the ball while keeper B1 is trying to gain possession and their crosses collide. Correct procedure

A: stop play immediately. Interference on attackman A1. Free clear for Team B.

B: no call. Legal play as the keeper's stick can be checked outside the crease if there is no possession.

Rule 4

46. On a faceoff, player A6, who is behind the defensive restraining line, crosses the boundary line of the box, laterally, toward the sideline, but remains behind the restraining line. This is legal.

A: yes

47. Team B is clearing and the 20 second count is on. Loose ball occurs. Count is suspended until Team B regains possession.

51. You are the faceoff official and Team A gains possession during the faceoff in their own defensive half of the field. Correct procedure is to signal possession and

Rule 4. Use field diagram.

54. A1 shoots and scores. Referee places the ball for a faceoff at the center X. A double horn sounds. Coach of Team B requests a stick check on player A1. Official judges that the stick has been modified to gain an advantage. Correct procedure

A: disallow goal. A1 serves one minute non-releasable penalty. Restart at the X.

B: disallow goal. A1 serves a 3 minute non-releasable penalty. Award ball to Team B at the face off X.

Rule 4

55. In a scrimmage area, A1 is legally checked and falls to the ground injured. Play continues around him. Correct procedure

A: official monitors to make sure he doesn't interfere with play.

B: stop play immediately. Always protect the safety of the injured player.

Rule 4

56. A1 is running down the field in his attack half of the field with no player from Team B near him; he loses a shoe while running, and then shoots at the goal and scores. Referee allows goal.

57. 4th quarter ends in a tie with Team A in possession of the ball and a man up. Correct procedure for the overtime period is

Rule 5

60. Team A, which has already called for an unsuccessful equipment check, calls for another equipment check and has no time outs left. Equipment is found to be legal. Correct procedure

A: No infraction. Resume play.

B: Team A is assessed a technical foul. Restart according to rule.

Rule 5

61. A3 has beaten B2 who swings his stick to check A3 and strikes A3 on the shoulder in an attempt to get A3's stick. Flag down. B2 serves one minute for slashing.

A: True

Rule 5

62. B1, while playing A1, makes glancing contact on A1's head with his crosse. The official deems the contact was not a definite strike. Correct procedure

A: flag down. B1 serves one minute for slashing

B: no foul has occurred.

Rule 6

72. Goalkeeper B1 has possession of the ball outside the crease and begins to run with the ball out of the defensive area. Riding player A1 runs through the crease while chasing B1. Correct procedure

A: play on.

B: flag down. Crease violation, A1 serves 30 seconds.

Rule 6

73. A2 has possession of the ball in the attack zone. B1 is defending A1 in the attack zone. B1 prevents A1 from moving by using the portion of his crosse that is between his hands. Correct procedure?

A: flag down, holding.

B: flag down only if B1 has the ball.

Rule 6

74. A1 drops his crosse with the ball in it. The ball is not stuck in his crosse. A2 kicks the crosse on the ground trying to gain access to the ball. Referee allows this. Correct procedure?
